With the 50/50 winnings, Kelsey was able to enhance an existing program at Burn Camp and also introduce new activities related to the theme for this year's camp - Harry Potter!

For 2 summers, Kelsey and I have distributed books to all of the camper's cabins as The Children's Burn Camp "Giving Library". These are gently used books mostly donated by a local school district who was consolidating schools and therefore had duplication and excess in their libraries. Campers were encouraged to bring books home for themselves and their siblings. Because of the 50/50 winnings we were able to provide camper-sized reusable book bags with our Giving Library logo!



In keeping with the Harry Potter theme, Kelsey used a portion of the 50/50 winnings to book the nationally ranked Quidditch Team from Boston University to spend an entire day at Burn Camp teaching each group how to play. This activity took place on the very first full day of camp leading to fantastic team building opportunities in which our new campers, counselors, and returning campers had a chance to get to know each other, build confidence, surpass their "limits", and have an overall awesome time! With the remaining 50/50 winnings Kelsey organized a Harry Potter inspired Tri-wizard Tournament!



This was a full-camp activity in which the age groups were mixed up. The younger campers had an opportunity to hangout with our older campers who serve as fantastic role models and mentors. Campers competed in three different tasks. The first was the Human Knot, an activity that involves team work and communication to solve. When teams finish, they were given a golden egg with the directions to complete the second task. The second task was a Fun Run through the Forbidden Forest. Campers were outfitted with flag football belts. Their flags represent their life bar, and campers had to run, jog, or walk a small course with counselors waiting along the way to try and steal their flags. Once at the waterfront the campers had a water balloon team activity which they LOVED!
